In responding to the most threatening epidemic ever to confront business, the Chamber's HIV/AIDS Desk aims to:

- Provide current accurate information in order to minimise the impact of the epidemic on businesses;
- Provide specialist assistance in the development of clear workplace policies and effective HIV/AIDS programmes for those suffering from the Virus;
- Continuously update members on pertinent information such as legislation, employee benefits and the provision of treatment;
- In consultation with members, develop codes of best practice in managing the epidemic, including codes on voluntary testing, nutrition, stress management and treatment.

# **AIDS FORUM**

The Chamber will continue to hold the quarterly AIDS Forum, wherein business leaders, HR practitioners and other relevant persons are able to discuss current HIV/AIDS-related topics, such as the provision of drug treatment to employees, and the legal issues surrounding testing.

# **HIV/AIDS WORKPLACE POLICY DEVELOPMENT**

The Chamber offers all members a generic HIV/AIDS policy for development and subsequent implementation in their businesses.

#### **ADVICE AND TRAINING**

Subsequent to training staff on the implementation of a comprehensive policy, the Chamber offers comprehensive training in:

- \* HIV/AIDS Programme development and implementation
- \* Awareness and Counselling
- The prevention of unfair discrimination;
- \* The management of incapacity and ill-health.

# CERTIFICATE COURSE IN THE MANAGEMENT OF HIV/AIDS

The Chamber is also in the process of developing the curriculum for the Certificate Course in HIV/AIDS Management. It is anticipated that, subject to

accreditation by the South African Qualifications Authority, the course will be offered by no later than March 2002.

# **CODES OF BEST PRACTICE**

In association with HEARD (the Health Economics and HIV/AIDS Research Division of the University of Natal, Durban), the Chamber will be publishing a Best Practices Journal for employers. It is expected that the Journal be published by the end of February 2002.
