


Over the past year DRA implemented new measures to ensure the highest quality data is produced. Emphasis has always been placed on quality control, both during data collection, as well as in the capturing process.

Our new systems draw on best practices identified both nationally and internationally and we believe that this quality assurance process places DRA at the forefront of specialist development research in South Africa.

DRA utilises a three tier quality control process. In the field, fieldworkers check completed questionnaire schedules daily, to ensure that all questions are answered and skips are followed.

The checked questionnaires are handed to team leaders who, whilst in the field, perform a second quality check on each questionnaire. They focus on skip patterns, as well as ensuring that answers correspond with previous responses and follow logical process. Should any data be incomplete, missing, skip patterns not followed, or a discrepancy exist between responses in one schedule, the questionnaires are returned to the fieldworker, who re-administers the questionnaire and corrects any errors.

Quality Assurance

On completion of each survey area to the satisfaction of team leaders, questionnaires are submitted to the DRA office.

Dedicated personnel perform random checks on each team's as well as individual fieldworker's questionnaires.

In addition, telephonic or physical call-backs are done on 5% to 10% of randomly selected questionnaires.

DRA is currently implementing a 'double capture' mechanism. We recognise that even with stringent controls in the field, errors can occur in the capture process.

All data is captured twice, using the same structure. Whilst this necessitates a longer time period in project planning, it guarantees a consistently high standard.

Finally, an overall validation of the entire database is conducted on final output tables to verify quality and consistency. Analysis is run using either SPSS or STATA, allowing use of their advanced analytical tools.

Although the new procedures may require a little more time and resources, we believe they present the best means to meet our clients' needs and ensure the highest quality information possible.




